Water Req.:	Occasional - once a month or so, depending on temperatures and wind.	
Habitat Value:	Pollinators	

Comments and Maintenance:

Forms clumps of evergreen sword-shaped leaves that are topped with purple flowers with yellow and white falls. Nice under oaks or in shady dry places. Important nectar producer for native bees. Deer resistant.
