Subject: California Public Records Act request

Dear Ms. Scholink and Ms. Horca:

Please reply by email to nikki@ventanaview.net in order to confirm receipt of this request. I left voice messages for both of you earlier today to provide advance notice that the Monterey Bay Chapter of the California Native Plant Society would be submitting a request for information.

Pursuant to the California Public Records Act, I request the following information:

1. Preferably in electronic format (e.g. PDF), the most recent draft Habitat Conservation Plan for the South of Tioga project, or if a single document approaching a draft has not yet been produced, the most substantial existing document or documents that would be precursors to a draft HCP or indicators of the potential content of a draft HCP, including relevant communications between City staff, project proponents, consultants, California Department of Fish and Wildlife staff and US Fish and Wildlife Staff.

This HCP is referenced in Council minutes from 6/5/18 as follows: " Richard James of EMC Planning Group presented on the proposed changes and comments of the South of Tioga Project. The Habitat Conservation Plan is in progress and will be able to be sent to Fish and Wildlife in several weeks."

2. Preferably in electronic format (e.g. PDF), the "Resolution" referenced in the following statement on the city's web site: "There is no charge to review public records. There are fees associated with obtaining copies of records. The fees are established by Resolution and vary depending upon the type of record and the method in which the record is provided."

It is my understanding that under the Act, the City has 10 days to provide the information, or explain any exemptions or delays.
